

Art Appreciation/ One Part – High School

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This one-semester course will introduce learners to the various forms of the visual arts, such as painting, sculpture, film, and more. Students will learn how to look at a work of art, identify and compare key characteristics in artworks, and understand the role art has played throughout history. Through hands-on activities, virtual museum tours, discussion, and research, learners will develop an overall appreciation for the art they encounter in their daily lives.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Understand and explain the significance of artworks in Western and non-Western cultures
- Identify the medium, and explain the technique, used to create works of art
- Identify and analyze formal elements, principles of design, and stylistic characteristics found in artworks from various art historical periods
- Converse with others about art, using visual literacy skills and relevant terminology acquired in the course
- Discuss and evaluate the impact of societal conditions on the production of artwork
- Analyze a work of art, placing it in historical, social, and cultural context
- Create works of art utilizing techniques such as perspective, and concepts such as color theory
