

Spanish III/Block - High School

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This third year of Spanish is a continuation of the first two years. The student will continue to improve listening, speaking, reading and writing skills through activities that are based on pedagogically proven methods of foreign language instruction. Throughout the course, students learn to express themselves using ever-increasing vocabulary, present-tense verbs, past-tense verbs, articles, and adjectives. Grammar is introduced and practiced in innovative and interesting ways with a variety of learning styles in mind.

Culture is embedded throughout the course in an attempt to help the learner focus on the Spanish-speaking world and its culture, people, geographical location and history.

The course is aligned to the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Language standards.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Talk about how they get to different places and explore various modes of transportation available in the Spanish-speaking world.
- Talk about other countries and nationalities.
- Learn history related to the Spanish-speaking world.
- Talk about jobs and professions one can have.
- Learn to talk about the future using the future tense.
- Talk about how people feel using a wide variety of adjectives and expressions.
- Express the conditional, talking about what would happen.
- Talk about illness, body parts, health and health facilities in Latin America.
- Talk about other countries and nationalities.
- Learn history related to the Spanish-speaking world.
- Talk about jobs and professions one can have and how to procure one.
- Incorporate the preterit and imperfect to describe the past.
- Talk about how people and objects using a wide variety of adjectives, pronouns and expressions.
- Use the imperative to create simple commands in the positive and negative.
- Make comparisons of inequality and equality.
- Talk about the systems of measurement, especially the metric system.
- Understand the difference between literal and conceptual translation.
- Use the passive voice to describe action.
- Learn about Hispanic influences in the United States.
